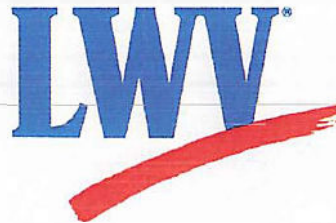
The Florida Constitution requires a high quality free public education system.

** **NOTE:** Public money for vouchers (scholarships) and Education Savings Accounts (ESAs) are managed by a private scholarship funding organization (Step Up for Students) which receives up to 3% of every voucher and ESA awarded. Step Up for Students is among the largest charities in the United States with assets totaling more than \$1B.
